Tara Challoner, Farming and Wildlife Officer, reports on the national and local importance of moorlands as habitats for wading birds and will share Upper Nidderdale's survey results highlighting what improvements have been observed over the past few years.

Mary is an author, producer and conservationist specialising in natural history and the environment. She has gained many awards for her work in radio, TV and internet production. Mary has also produced natural history series such as Saving Species, Natural Histories and Shared Planet.

GETTING TO GRIPS WITH BOGS

by Dr Tim Thom, The Yorkshire Peat Partnership

Peatlands are hugely important habitats and home to an array of unique plants and animals. Globally, peat contains the largest amount of carbon of all terrestrial ecosystems.

The Yorkshire Peat Partnership is working in Upper Nidderdale to restore this delicate ecosystem.

Dr Tim Thom will present an illustrative and informative talk discussing the types of peat bogs that can be found locally. He will explain what work the Yorkshire Peat Partnership have been doing to restore degraded peatland habitats, highlighting the increasing biodiversity and reduction of CO₂ being released into the atmosphere. Through careful restoration these peatland habitats can be enjoyed by future generations to come.
